The purpose of the Children's Church is "to help children have their own worship, enjoy it and be able to worship and listen to the Word with children of their age, where it is explained to them at their level why we do what we do in worship."

This is a suggested program for working with the Children's Church. Please remember to review the **Children's Church Manual** to organize it properly starting with the first Sunday of the year.

The suggested themes for each Sunday have been selected to emphasize the annual sub-theme for 2021:

The Life Invested Through Service - 2 Timothy 2: 2

Don't overlook some special days of the **Christian Calendar**, such as: Palm Sunday, Easter, Pentecost, and Christmas. We understand that celebrating these special days at Children's Church will enrich the children's worship experience of God.

These monthly emphases are geared toward guiding children in different aspects of discipleship and the life of church service. You can use them by focusing on them on the Sunday we suggest, but you can also do related activities any Sunday of the month. The purpose is that through these emphases, children can be discipled as they grow, being and feeling part of the Church.

Remember that you are the pastor of the children's church and they are your flock. Prepare each "sermon" and program with the same heart of Jesus.

## MISSIONS FOR CHILDREN

- Contact the President of Nazarene Missions International (NMI) of your local church to acquire the Missionary Study Guide for Children, and work on the missionary lesson and emphasis each month, on Sunday as determined as a church.
- In addition, you can use the mission books for children, and thus develop in them a greater appreciation for missions and an openness to hearing the voice of God to a missionary call.
- You can assign a service activity during the week or month for the children to do, either individually, in pairs, or together with other children or with adults.

## **Recommendations for Children's Church**

## Remember that Children's Church is not another Sunday School class.

- Read the Children's Church Manual as a resource to develop a special time each Sunday, involve the children in worship, and guide them to participate in all aspects and emphasis of the Church of the Nazarene.
- Suggested Hymn of the Month: In addition to the songs of praise and worship used in the Children's Church, we suggest each month a hymn from our hymnal for worship. It offers the new generation the opportunity to learn about the musical and theological heritage that the church has proclaimed for years.
- It is important to give an explanation of the vocabulary used in each hymn and song that is taught and that everything we teach and sing is understandable to the children.
- Ask the Pastor of the church to administer the Lord's Supper in Children's Church. It would be good if this Sacrament was provided to the children once every three months, or every month if possible, or on the day that the whole church celebrates Communion.
- Provide a time for the Pastor to share his testimony with the children.
- Engage adults to share their faithful testimony experiences with the children.
- Involve the children in church prayer and worship times by leading, reciting what they have learned, praying, etc.
- Prepare your sermon using the biblical quotes from the program and enrich it with experiences
  or illustrations that motivate and attract your children. Pray for your flock and always remember
  to invite them to receive Jesus into their life.

May God use your life and ministry at his service, to bless the lives of the children in our Churches, and that many more can be reached for Christ.

## JANUARY: THE PURPOSE OF JESUS' LIFE

Use the first Sunday of each month to introduce the monthly emphasis of Children's Church.

Purpose: That the children know that they must serve as Jesus served.

Monthly Memory Verse: "just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many" (Matthew 20:28).

- 03. Jesus helps those who suffer. Matthew 15:29.37; Luke 4:17-21
- 10. Jesus eats with the marginalized and undesirable. Mark 2:13-17
- 17. Jesus teaches the importance of serving. Matthew 20:20-28
- 24. Jesus washes his disciples' feet. John 13:1-16.
- **31.** Children's Missionary Study
  - Model a life of service for children in your attitudes and actions.
  - Clarify with the children who are called by society "marginalized and undesirable" and help them with ideas on how to serve them. Make a big chart so that they can fill in the spaces. Let it be visible all year round and help them develop a service project. (See Annex).
  - During the month, teach the children the hymn "IN THE SERVICE OF THE KING".
  - Include children in helping in different activities and services of the church: lead, pray and read the Bible and recite what they have learned
  - Promote humility and compassion among the children as biblical principles for service.
  - Teach the children that Jesus is our model for service, and encourage them to serve as He did.

#### FEBRUARY: LOVING MY NEIGHBOR

Use the first Sunday of each month to introduce the monthly emphasis of Children's Church.

Purpose: That the children will understand who their neighbor is and how they can help them.

<u>Monthly Memory Verse</u>: "Love does no harm to a neighbor. Therefore love is the fulfillment of the law." (Romans 13:10)

- **07.** Showing love. 11 Kings 4:8-17; Acts 20.35
- 14. Being kind, even when they mistreat me. 2 Kings 5:1-19; 1 Corinthians 10:24.
- **21.** A good helper. Luke 10.30-35; Galatians 6.10.
- **28.** The joy of sharing with others. Genesis 13:1-11; 14:1-16; John 13.35.
  - Open a conversation circle where the children express who their neighbor is and if they have been abused at any time. Direct their minds to the joy of serving, even those who mistreat us.
  - Use the role-play for the story of the Good Samaritan or you can access these videos Develop a service project with the children, either individually, in pairs, or collectively. Children like to be useful, put them in motion (see Annex)
  - Schedule an activity outside or inside the church (sleepover, picnic, breakfast, snack, movie, etc.), where children gather to celebrate friendship, with games and card exchange.
  - Suggested Hymn for the month: "RESCUE THE PERISHING".

## MARCH: SERVING MY FAMILY

Use the first Sunday of each month to introduce the monthly emphasis of Children's Church.

Purpose: That the children help and serve their own family.

Monthly Memory Verse: "Finally, all of you, be like-minded, be sympathetic, love one another, be compassionate and humble" (1 Peter 3:8)

- **07**. A family that decides to serve God. Joshua 24:15
- **14**. My family, my blessing. John 11:1,2, 5; Luke 10:38-42; John 12:9-11; Ephesians 6:14-15
- **21**. My place of blessing in the family. John 12:1-11.
- **28.** Family devotions. Prov. 22:6; 2 Tim. 3:15; Psalms 8:2
  - Teach the children the importance of serving and helping each other in their family.
  - Invite children to share their time, skills, and love with their family in practical ways.
  - Have each child write a list of requests and commit to pray for the needs of their mom, dad, sister, brother, etc.
  - During the month, carry out the project "Serving my family" where each child plans how to serve their family members. (Ask how can I help you? Write a note of encouragement, plan something special for someone this month, surprise someone with their favorite sweet, forgive, etc. and thus show God's love.)
  - Talk about people in their life who they could give a homemade coupon with specific offers that contains ways they could serve. For example:
    - "I will serve God by helping you cut the grass."
    - "I will serve God by helping you to clean up the house."
    - "I will serve God by making you breakfast."
    - "I will serve God by telling you all the good things that I see in you."
    - "I will serve God by taking your dog for a walk."
    - o "I will serve God by helping you clean the car."
  - Promote family devotions by giving parents and children ideas for how to do it.
  - Prepare a song or a skit to participate in Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday; also prepare children to give and offering for evangelism around the world.
  - Suggested hymn for the month "TAKE MY LIFE AND LET IT BE".

## **APRIL:** Using My Talents to Help

Use the first Sunday of each month to introduce the monthly emphasis of Children's Church.

Purpose: That the children know that the Lord gives us talents so that we can use them to serve others.

Monthly Memory Verse:..."well done, good and faithful servant! You have been faithful with a few things; I will put you in charge of many things. Come and share your master's happiness!" (Matthew 25:21).

- **04**. The Lord gives us talents so we can serve others. Romans 12:6-8; 1 Corinthians 12.8-10
- 11. I am a gift for others. Romans 12.7
- 18. The joy of serving with our talents. Matthew 25:21
- 25. Using God's gifts in service. Matthew 25:14-30
  - Make paper hearts for each child. Tell them that you want to start a "Secret Service Club." Encourage the children to bring their hearts home, to the church, to school, and to secretly serve those around them, leaving a heart in every place they do the work. For example, they could make their brother or sister's bed and leave a heart on the pillow. They could help their teacher and leave a heart on the desk. They could clean some area of the church and leave a heart. Ask the children to report to you next week about their feelings about serving someone in secret.
  - Give each child a "Gift Certificate" to give to someone else. They can make a present using their talents and do something for someone else. It could be baking a cake, mowing the grass, or taking care of their little brother. Think about what you can do and who you can do it for, and then write the certificate. (See Annex).
  - Train children on how to serve the Lord by serving others and the church through using their gifts and talents, participating in adult worship, singing, reading, reciting scripture, praying, preaching, etc.
  - Have each child think and write how they will use their skills to help in their home, church, school, neighborhood. Ask them to report on what was done.
  - According to the talents and gifts detected, think about how the children's church will serve
    the community: service in the home of an elder, work and witness, caring for nature, cleaning
    the streets or the park, presenting a poetry, song or a drama, share a brochure with needy
    children in your community, draw a letter or picture for someone, play an instrument, etc.
  - Suggested hymn for the month: "BRIGHTEN THE CORNER WHERE YOU ARE".

## MAY: I AM USEFUL IN MY COMMUNITY OF FAITH

Use the first Sunday of each month to introduce the monthly emphasis of Children's Church.

Purpose: That the children know that they were created to be useful.

<u>Monthly Memory Verse</u>: "Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers" (Galatians 6:10).

- **02.** Members of the Family of God. Acts 2:42, 44, 46 y 47; Romans 16:1, 2; 1 Corinthians 12.27; Ephesians 2:19; Hebrews 10:25; 1 Peter 2:9,10; Psalm 95:1, 6,7.
- 09. A community that God uses to serve. Acts 4:32-35; 5:12-16
- **16.** Showing others the love of God through the church. Matthew 5:12-16
- 23. Serving others is serving Jesus himself. Matthew 25:35-40, 44-46.
- **30.** Children's Missionary Study
  - Encourage the children to practice the Christian life in their daily attitudes and actions in helping others: humility, mercy, diligence, constancy, excellence, joy.
  - If at the beginning of the year you developed a church service project, it is time to start it. Perhaps you can involve adults, youth or adolescents in the project.
  - Make suggestions for them to think about things like keeping the meeting house clean, being kind to everyone, reaching out to other children who may be scared or sad and trying to cheer them up, showing reverence in meetings, being vigilant and aware, observing if someone needs help, giving help to Sr. Adults and teachers, being kind and listening to everyone. etc.
  - Learn that when we work together, we do many things that we could not do alone, and that collaborating and cooperating spontaneously fuels our love for God and for others.
  - Suggested hymn for the month: "I'LL BE A SUNBEAM".

## JUNE: MY OFFERINGS HELP

Use the first Sunday of each month to introduce the monthly emphasis of Children's Church.

Purpose: That the children express appreciation, service, and love for Jesus.

Monthly Memory Verse: "... Remembering the words the Lord Jesus himself said: 'It is more blessed to give than to receive'" (Acts 20:35).

- **06.** Jesus, the offering of love. Philippians 2:1-11
- 13. More than sufficient. Exodus 35—36:7
- **20.** A Gift for Jesus. Matthew 26:6-13; Mark 14:3-9; John 12:1-8
- 27. I give with generosity. Mark 12:41-44; Luke 21:1-4.
  - Ask the children the following questions: How do we build a church? How do we pay for maintenance costs? Where does the money come from? How much money do you think is needed for church work? Where do we get the money needed for the church?
  - Emphasize that our offering is a gift of love, that we worship God with it, and that there is joy in giving when it is done willingly.
  - Ask: What can we offer to God besides money? Giving our time and service is also giving. Is there something we can do as a group as a service to the Lord? Listen to their ideas (make decorations, help with the offering baskets or empty the trash cans, etc.).
  - Suggest giving generously and showing our love for Jesus by helping others. When we give a gift to a friend or our parents, what are we showing them? How can you show love to Jesus and others? Write a poem (See Annex), allow them to read it and say who gave with joy.
  - Remind children that their mission offerings also meet needs beyond their church.

## **JULY: SHARING THE GOOD NEWS**

Use the first Sunday of each month to introduce the monthly emphasis of Children's Church.

Purpose: That the children are motivated to share the gospel of Christ with other people.

Monthly Memory Verse: "...Go into all the world and announce to everyone the Good News". (Mark 16:15)

- **0**4. Phillip instructs the Ethiopian. Acts 8.26-40
- 11. Christians share of gospel. Acts 4:1-31; Acts 8:4-13.
- 18. How do we share the Good News?
- **25**. We go out to share the Good News. Mark 16:15.
- Motivate the children to share their faith with others and invite them to church. Each Sunday we
  want some children to share about how they have given testimony about their Christian life to
  others.
- Teach the children 2-3 methods of personal evangelism (Consult the manual of Children Evangelism), and have them practice among themselves, and encourage them to share Christ with others, and invite them to Vacation Bible School if that is celebrated this month.
- Pray for the new children that may attend the VBS and that their parents will allow them to attend.
- Plan a time to go out with the children and share the Good News. Choose a neighborhood close to the church or a close park to take the children and help them put into practice the evangelism methods they learned.
- Find in your community children who have special needs, street children, homeless children without basic food, sick children, etc. and share the Good News and Bibles, or Bible portions, or scripture handouts with them. Look for other ways to help those children.
- Suggested Hymn for the month: "ARE YOU WASHED IN THE BLOOD?"

## **AUGUST: EXAMPLES OF SERVICE**

Use the first Sunday of each month to introduce the monthly emphasis of Children's Church.

Purpose: That each child understands that even though they are young, God wants them to help others.

Monthly Memory Verse: "...Be good and compassionate to others..." (Ephesians 4:32)

- **01.** A child who helps a general. 2 Kings 5
- **08.** Miriam, Moses' sister. Exodus 1-2:10
- 15. Samuel, the small helper. 1 Samuel 1:9-11, 20, 27, 28; 2:11, 18, 26; 3:1
- 22. Children who help. 2 Kings 4:1-7
- **29.** Children's Missionary Study
- Invite people from the congregation who serve to share their testimony with the children to motivate them to serve.
- Hang up in the room pictures of children who represent Miriam, Samuel, Naaman's servant girl and the children of the widow. Have the children draw their self-portrait or write their name next to the character with whom they identify and want to help in the same way.
- Each child can make a double entry chart where they write the names of the people they will help and how they will help.
- Involve children in the adult gathering by playing instruments, leading a song, sharing a testimony, reciting memory verses, making prayer requests, etc., following the example of other servers.
- Suggested hymn for the month: "GIVE OF YOUR BEST TO THE MASTER".

## **SEPTEMBER: THE BIBLE ASKS ME TO SERVE**

Use the first Sunday of each month to introduce the monthly emphasis of Children's Church.

## Purpose: Show the children the Word of God as a model for their life.

Monthly Memory Verse: "...your servant will meditate on your decrees. Your statutes are my delight; they are my counselors." (Psalms 119:23-24)

- **05.** Everything we do must be done for the Lord. Col.3:23
- **12**. God is looking for faithful and wise servants. Matthew 24:45-47
- 19. Do it with humility. Acts 20:19
- 26. Being constant and diligent.. Romans 12:11
- Plan and carry out an "Art Saturday", inviting families to work with the children in making posters, murals, drawings, and paintings on the importance of studying the Bible.
- Invite the children to give for the Bible Society in their country.
- Pray thanking for the Holy Bible and for the Bible Societies and their work in translation, production and distribution.
- Pass out Bible tracts or portions to your neighbors and friends, put in them the address and hours of your church services.
- Invite the children to find the text to memorize in as many versions as possible, with the help of their parents or an adult.
- Do a Bible Reading marathon; you can use Psalms or Proverbs or a gospel.
- Hold memorization contests, either from the books of the Bible or from verses that talk about service.
- Suggested hymn for the month: "WONDERFUL WORDS OF LIFE".

## **OCTOBER:** THE JOY OF HELPING

Use the first Sunday of each month to introduce the monthly emphasis of Children's Church.

Purpose: That the children experience what it means to help and share, and the joy that God puts in their heart when they do.

Monthly Memory Verse: "Worship the LORD with gladness; come before him with joyful songs." Psalm 100:2

- 03. I must work and serve until Jesus comes. Luke 12.37; Ephesians 6:6-7
- 10. Jesus has already left us his example. John 13:15
- 17. One day Jesus will tell us... Matthew 25:21; Hebrews 6:10
- 24 ... And we will get our reward. Matthew 25:34-40,44-46; Colossians 3:24
- **31**. Children's Missionary Study
- Each Sunday provide a time to share testimonies about how it feels to help, give and serve others; remembering that by serving others we serve God.
- Emphasize that Jesus wants us to live lovingly serving everyone; offer ourselves as a gift to them and be rewarded with joy and happiness.
- If you developed a service project in January, review the actions in the table and evaluate the results, achievements, and the impact they had on the lives of others and on their own. You may want to share their beautiful project(s) with the adults.
- For the culmination of their service project, they can plan "The Feast of the Good Servant" where they prepare and share a lunch and can recognize everyone in their service to the Lord. You may want to invite those whom they served in a special way.

## **NOVEMBER: KINGDOM CITIZENS**

Use the first Sunday of each month to introduce the monthly emphasis of Children's Church.

Purpose: That Children understand that the King's subjects serve with all their hearts.

Monthly Memory Verse: "We are receiving a kingdom that can't be shaken. So let us be thankful. Then we can worship God in a way that pleases him. Let us worship him with deep respect and wonder." (Hebrews 12:28)

- 07. Am I a citizen of the Kingdom of God? John 1:9-13; Matthew 16:24; Romans 8:15
- 14. I Serve with Gratitude. Hebrews 12:9,28
- 21. I Serve with Reverence. Hebrews 12:28; Philippians 2:10
- 28. I Serve willingly. Hebrews 12:29:
- Help children understand what the Kingdom is and who are citizens of it.
- Teach the children that the motives and attitudes with which we serve others and God are of the utmost importance: 1. Give before receiving. 2. Deliver before you take. 3. Love before being loved.
- Provide service opportunities for each of them from the smallest to the largest.
- Remind children that we serve God by lovingly serving their friends, family, neighbors, by helping and caring for people, by caring for nature.
- Have each child evaluate himself in his service, his attitudes and his outreach, and have them express how they felt when serving: (See Annex)
- Suggested hymn for the month: Remember again this song "IN THE SERVICE OF THE KING".

## **DECEMBER: GOD WITH US!**

Use the first Sunday of each month to introduce the monthly emphasis of Children's Church.

Purpose: That the children observe that the humble and obedient possess a heart of service.

Monthly Memory Verse: "Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign: The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel." (Isaiah 7:14)

- 05 Joseph and Mary said "yes" to God. Luke 1:26-38; Matthew 1:18-25
- 12. Angels served and praised God. Luke 2:8.14
- 19. The shepherds ran to see the baby. Luke 2:15,16
- 26. The magicians followed the star. Matthew 2:9-11
- Emphasize that all the people in the birth of Jesus spontaneously offered their lives to serve God in his Plan of Redemption for the world.
- Plan a party to celebrate Jesus' birthday. The children can prepare cards and give them to the
  people who served during the year and / or to each other, make a gift and in the name of Jesus
  give it to a person in need or to the neighbors in the neighborhood.
- Don't forget to prepare the children to participate or serve the church during the celebration of Jesus' birthday. They may wish to take the skit or songs to an orphanage or nursing home.
- If time permits, they can hold a "Little Christmas School" or a "December Club" and open the doors of the church to the children of the community and children in need.
- Suggested Hymn: "ROOM FOR THEE".

**Garbage Walk:** The first two chapters of the Bible share how God created the world, declare that it is good, and challenge humanity to care for it. Children can serve by helping to care for the earth, even with something as simple as picking up trash from the floor. Find an area in your city or neighborhood that needs maintenance, such as a public park or alley. Give your children a plastic glove and a garbage bag, walk together and pick up the garbage you find. Pray for the people or businesses you see in the area. Discuss the experience when you are done, and include the reading of Genesis 1 and 2.

**Serving requires humility:** Note how Jesus teaches that serving God requires the kind of humility that is shown in washing the feet of another. Handing out a small hand towel and marker, invite the children to write on it some ways God has served them through others. Then encourage them to use the other side to write down some ways they will serve God by serving others at home, their friends at school, an older person in their neighborhood, etc.

Non-profit garage sale: Help the child see that we are surrounded by many people who have a need for things that we take for granted, such as food, clothes or money. Check out Luke 12:33 where Jesus taught about selling your things to take care of others, and organize a garage sale as a family or church where all the money you earn will be donated instead of keeping it. Put a box near your cash box with a sign that says "Food Donations" and another that says "Clothing Donations." Invite your clients to come back and join in blessing others. Decide which local ministry you will help with your effort, or look for people in your neighborhood who will be blessed with what you have done.

## **FEBRUARY**

**Friends serving friends:** Talk to your children about how their friends may need help or attention in some area of their life. Imagine ways you could help or take care of those needs, for example help a classmate in a subject or make sure they are not alone at recess, invite them to your house for popcorn, share your lunch or your dessert, defend them if they are being picked on, etc.. Helpl them understand what it means to serve God by serving others.

#### **MARCH**

Sermon Outline: My Family, My Blessing.

- · God cares a lot about families
- His greatest desire is to pour out blessings on your entire family.
- They are a family that Jesus loved very much.
- We will only speak of the siblings of the family, the Scripture doesn't mention the parents.
- God used all three, as he will use you today.
- If you serve and help, don't seek to be rewarded, God will do it. Your family is your blessing, they are the opportunity you have to serve.
- Ask God for forgiveness for fighting or criticizing your brother or sister and for wanting them to be the same as you, forgive your siblings and your parents if you have felt that they treated you unfairly.
- Serve your family with love and stop just wanting to receive and receive and never give.

Sermon Outline: My Place of Blessing in My Family.

- Families are very blessed when each part of the family takes its rightful place within it.
- Each member recognizes his talents and puts them to serve in favor of the family, without lawsuits, without waiting for the other to do the same.
- Recognize their weaknesses or disabilities and let no one take advantage of you.
- Like Martha, do what you do best: unite the family by serving them. Like Martha, learn that serving is loving, it is worshiping.
- Like Mary, be a worshiper in the presence of Jesus, pray, praise and intercede for your family, the church and the city; your priority is to serve when you take care of your family.
- Like Lazarus, preach Jesus and be a witness for Him.
- Honor your parents and recognize all the good they give you.
- Let's pray that God helps all members of your family to be strengthened by the Holy Spirit, that the whole family will know the love of Christ, and that we can receive much more abundantly than we ask or understand.

## **APRIL** Gift Coupon
