Jonah Learns A Lesson





1. Fold the sheet in half along the dotted line so that the pictures face out. Look at diagram 1. Cut through the black line to make an opening

2. Open the sheet and spread it out. Then, fold it in half so that boxes 2, 3, 4 and 5 are on the same side, as shown in diagram 2.

3. Fold the two ends of the booklet to the dotted line. See diagram 3.

4. Unfold the ends of the book. Now fold the sheet in half and, taking the ends, push them towards the center until the pages come together. Look at diagrams 4 and 5.

6. Use this booklet to review the Bible story. Read the message on page 8 and remember the important lesson that Jonah learned.

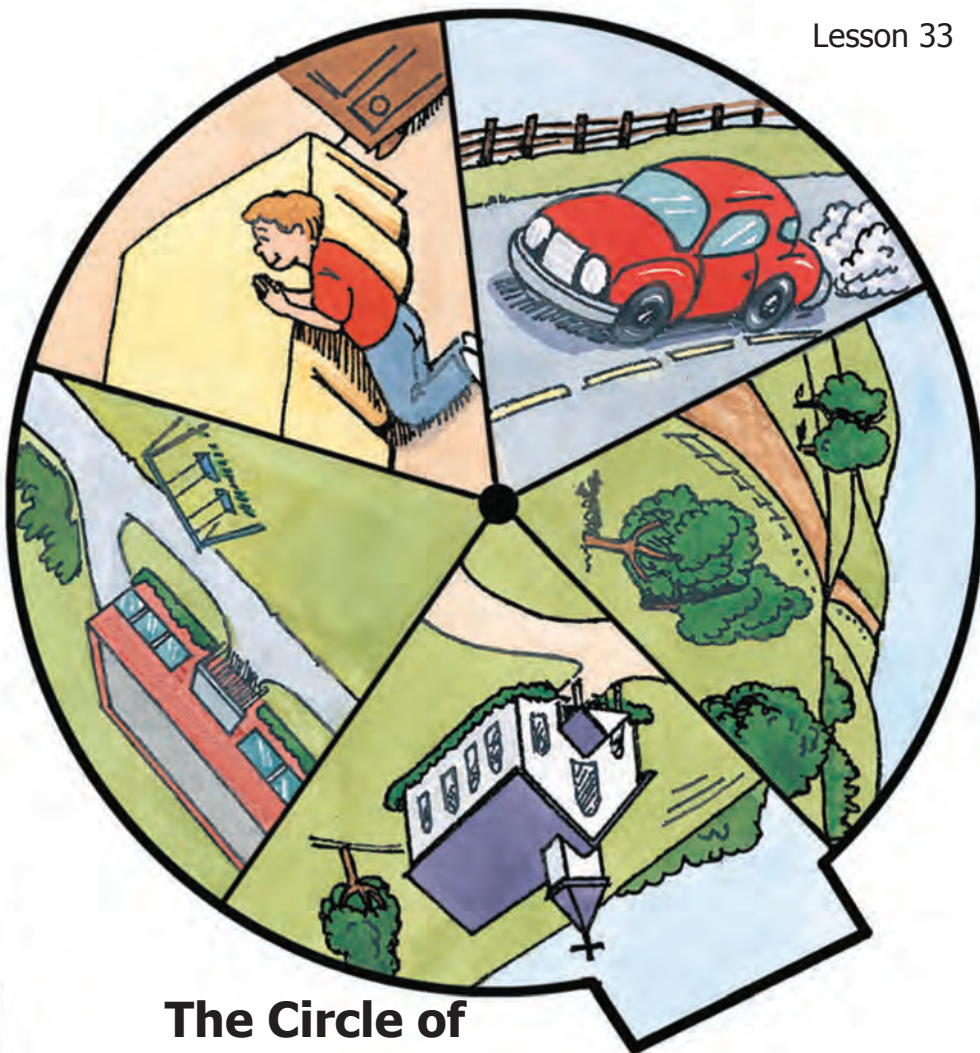
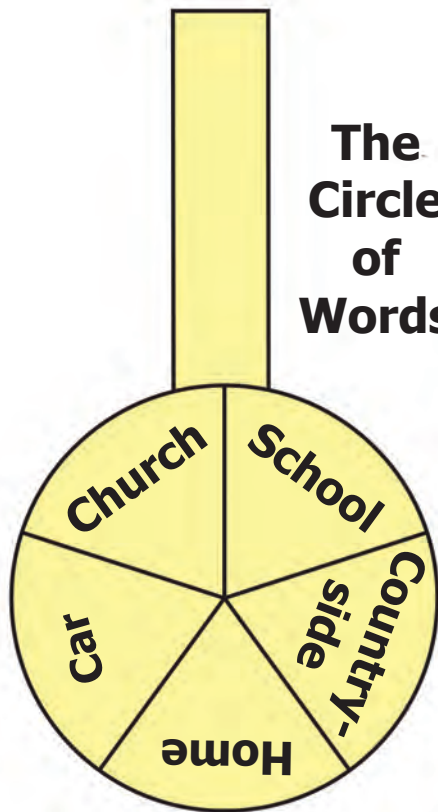

Instructions for assembling phylacteries (I recommend you use adhesive tape instead of glue): (1) Write your name on the lines in the center squares. (2) Cut out the two large squares and the two strips with verses. (3) Fold the squares along the dotted lines. (4) Cut along the black lines in the squares. (5) Glue sections A over sections B to form your phylactery. (6) You will need a long piece of yarn or sturdy string (long enough so you can tie it around your head). Find the center of the yarn. (7) Tape the center of the yarn in the space that says "Glue here" on the bottom of the phylactery. (8) Roll each strip with the Bible verses around a pencil. Place the two verses inside the phylactery. (9) Put the upper box on the lower one. Finally, tie the phylactery to your forehead, as the drawing shows.



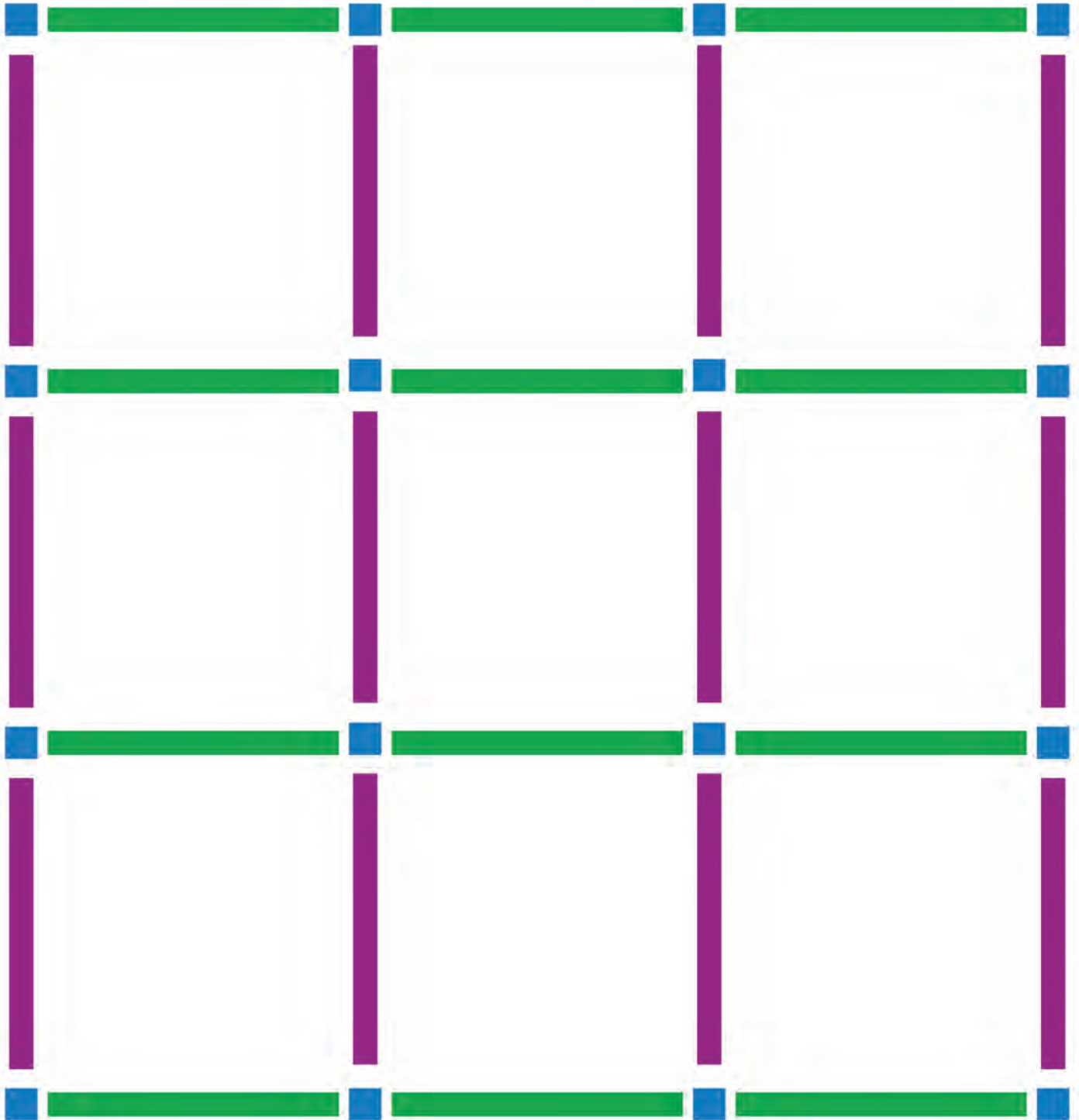

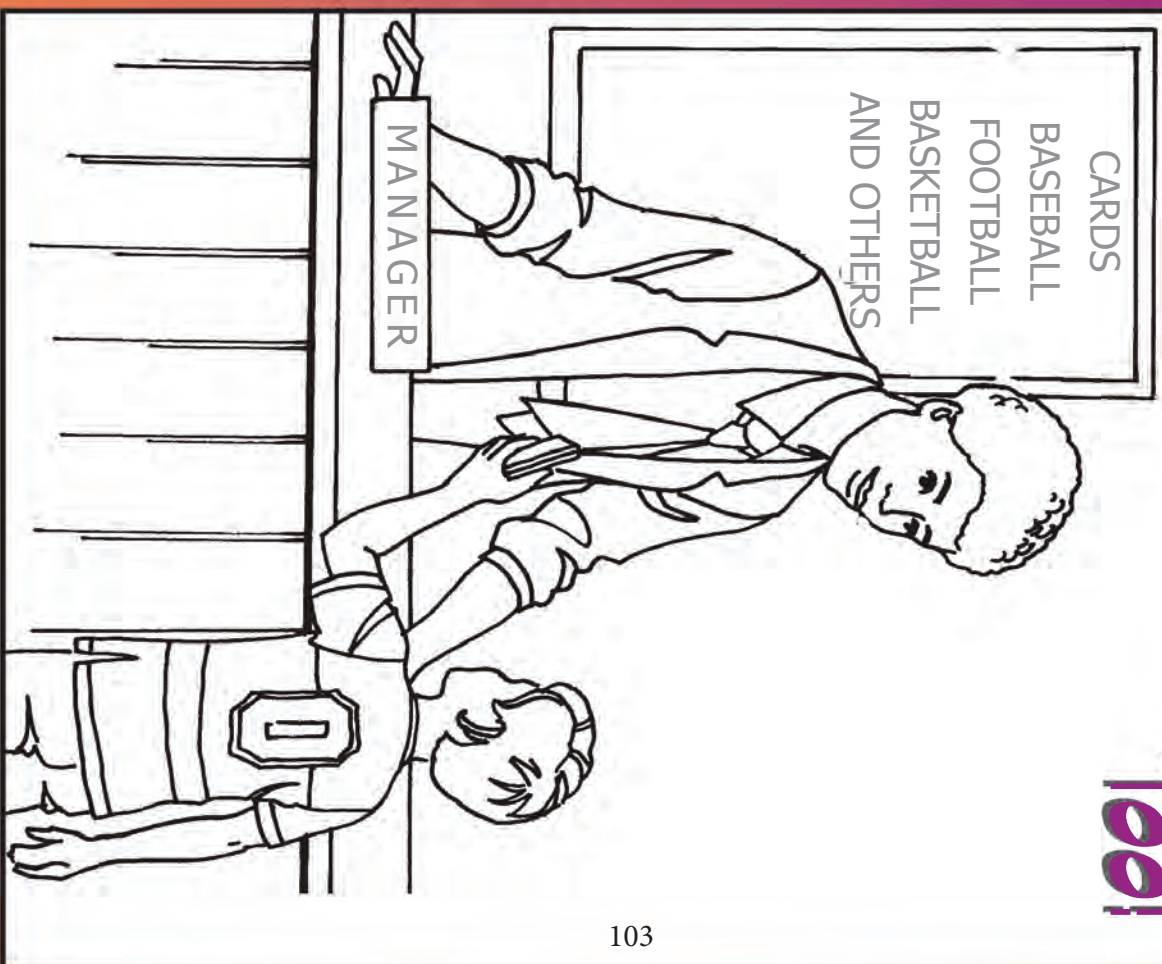
