PRAYER REQUESTS

We pray for:

- 1. The national governing authorities, that they would be guided by the Lord to wisely dictate strategies to keep the public safe during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- 2. The people of Guatemala, especially in the capitol, where there is the highest number of COVID-19 cases. Pray that they would understand the need to stay at home, and only leave when it is necessary with the appropriate precautions to avoid more infections.
- 3. The health of the more than 9,000 infected people who are in hospitals or at home.
- 4. The families of those who have died from the virus, including doctors and Nazarene brothers and sisters. Also pray for those who have lost loved ones for any reason, but,
 because of the state of emergency, have had to bury them without the support of their
 families and the family of faith. Pray they would find that the Lord is their strength and
 their comfort they need and that, as Christians, God is using us to lift them up in prayer.



- 5. The health professionals, both those caring for those ill with COVID-19 and those who serve in other areas, that God would protect them from infection and give them strength while they work long hours.
- 6. That God uses His people to be compassionate. In the streets of the capitol there are people who ask for help alongside their children. They expose themselves to the possibility of infection and respiratory illness during the rainy season and changes in weather.
- 7. Those who have lost their harvest or belongings recently due to the constant rain that has drenched the country.
- 8. Those who have lost their jobs, that they would be able to find another way to earn money to support their families.
- 9. The interim field strategy coordinator and the team that serves with him, that they would have wisdom to help guide church leadership in this time.
- 10. Pastors and church leaders. Though social media has served as a way for many district superintendents and pastors to preach the Word and guide their congregations spiritually, we pray that God would give wisdom to those who are unable to access them. Pray that they find a way to reach the members of their congregations since the state of emergency in the country does not allow people to meet in the church buildings.
- 11. The leaders of the different ministries in the local churches, districts, and congregations, that united they may continue to bring the message of salvation to those who need it, even in difficult circumstances.
- 12. The missionaries who serve in this country, many of them far from their children and families, that they might be able to continue serving God with wisdom and passion in the midst of difficult situations.
